Sheweth

That your Petitioner located in the
Month of June 1817 the East half of Lot
No. 3 in the 1st Concession of said Township
of Brock, under an Order from Your Honor
of the 26th of that Month, as a discharged
Seaman. That he has been settled on said
Land upwards of Twelve Months and, as
appears by the annexed Certificate, is now
living thereon, and has cleared four
Acres thereof, and built two Houses, one
of which is 22 feet long by 18 wide.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays
that Your Honor would be pleased to order
that he may now receive a Patent for the
said Land, as a discharged Seaman.

shall immediately settle thereon, and that the lands
"can not be alienated or disposed of until he shall
"have resided upon and cultivated a reasonable
"proportion of the same for the term of three years"

The foregoing being the only Official Communication
I have received, I can not state to your Honor, how far
the same may apply to Sailors, or with Certainty, under
what Rules, Regulations and limitations discharged
Soldiers and Sailors are intended to be settled by
His Majesty's Government.
