from the Crown. Wherefore your  
Petitioner humbly prays your Excellency  
will be pleased to grant him 200 Acres  
of the waste Lands, which he has means  
to settle and improve

Midlands District, and Province of Upper Canada,  
Emigrants, late from Ireland; have Nominated  
made and Appointed, Irvine Johnston of the same  
place, as aforesaid, our true and Lawful Attorney  
for us and in our Names, to appear for us at  
the Land Granting Department at York in the  
Province of Upper Canada, and to Locate for us  
all and Singular such lands as shall please  
the Government of the said Province to Grant unto  
us, - Ratifying and allowing all and Singular  
what ever our said Attorney shall do, or cause  
to be done Lawfully in and concerning the  
premises, in as full and perfect a manner as  
We could do, were we Personally present our selves.

set our hands and Seals at Hallowell this  
fourteenth day of March 1825.
