To The Right Honorable Guy Lord Dorchester, Captain General
and Governor in Chief of the Colonies of Quebec, Nova Scotia &
New Brunswick & their Dependencies, Vice Admiral of the same,
General Commander in Chief of all His Majesty's Forces in
the said Colonies & the Island of Newfoundland No: 105: Oct: 1802

The Memorial of Sir John Johnson Bart. in
behalf of the Heirs of the late Major Robert Leake of His
Majesty's late Provincial Regiment, called the King's Royal
Regiment of New York,

Humbly Sheweth.

That the said Robert
Leake had not at the time of his demise in June
last, for himself or family consisting of his Wife
and one Child, received any part of His Majesty's
ounty of Lands granted to His disbanded Provincial
Troops and other Loyalists on the reduction of the Army
in 1783.

Your Memorialist therefore prays
Your Excellency will take their case into your
consideration, and direct that such proportion
of Land as to your Excellency may seem ^{not} to be
Surveyed & laid out for the benefit of the Heirs, at
Carillon, on the south side of the Ottawa or Grand
River, and adjoining to, or near the Lands that may
be already granted on that Shore.
