The Memorial of Sir John Johnson Bart. in  
behalf of the Heirs of the late Major Robert Liaké of His  
Majesty's late Provincial Regiment, called the Kings Royal  
Regiment of New York,

Humbly Sheweth,

That the said Robert  
Liaké had not at the time of his demise in June  
last, for himself, or Family consisting of his Wife  
and one Child, received any part of His Majesty's  
bounty of Lands granted to His disbanded Provincial  
Troops and other Loyalists on the reduction of the Army  
in 1783.

Your Memorialist therefore prays  
Your Excellency will take their case into your  
consideration, and direct that such proportion  
of Land as to your Excellency may seem <sup>met</sup> to be  
surveyed & laid out for the benefit of the Heirs, at  
Cornellon, on the south side of the Ottawa or Grand  
River, and adjoining to, or near the Lands that may  
be already granted on that Shore.
