Excellency will take their Case under consideration  
and direct such proportion of Land as to Your  
Excellency shall seem meet, to be surveyed and  
laid out for the benefit of the Heirs, at Carrillon,  
on the south side of the Ottawa or Grand River,  
and adjoining to, or near the Lands that may be  
already granted on that Shore.
