The Memorial of Sir John Johnson Baronet &c.
Humbly sheweth

That your Memorialist did, on the 23^d of
September 1790 prefer a Petition for Grandisle, or Long
Island nearly opposite to Kingston, and whereas the
said Island has since been claimed as private property,
and the Grant thereof has been, as he humbly conceives
thereby delayed, your Memorialist therefore prays
that should such claim, contrary to the Opinion of the
Attorney and Solicitor General, be deemed valid, John
Cochran's Commencing nearly opposite the East End of
Grandisle, and extending from thence till nearly opposite
the River Thames may be granted to him for the
reasons stated in his aforesaid Memorial of the 23^d
of September 1790, and your Memorialist as in Duty
Bound will ever pray —
