of John Brown of U.S. Army.

Says that a man of the name of
Iron Johnson, has been for some time, and
is now employed by the American Government
as a Spy between Sacket's Harbour and
Kingston. Says that the said Johnson
is a portly full faced man, about five
feet five inches high about 35 years of age
generally wears brown Cloths, and is tolerably
well dressed, dark complexion, blue eyes
and brown hair, wears a round hat, has a
moderate strong voice, but not talkative.

Informant has repeatedly been
in company and knows the said Johnson well
and learned from him, that he has a brother
or some other relation, who resides about
twelve miles above Kingston in One of County
who gives him the information. Says
further the said Johnson goes monthly
and may be expected at Sacket's Harbour
about the twentieth Current.
