The Petition of Mary Fellows, wife of Nathan Fellows
of the Township of Grant Town, Yeoman,

Humbly Sheweth

That the Petitioner,
being the daughter of James Lake, a U. E. Loyalist, is entitled to
a grant of two hundred acres of land, and has obtained a Deed
therefor, and a certificate from the Land Board of the Midland
District, of the location of her said right on lot Number fourteen
in the Eighth Concession of the Township of Marquette in said
District, and the confirmation of the said Location by the said
Board; but the settlement duties on said lot have not been per-
formed, by reason of the ill state of her said husband's health,
for the last ten years past, and her increasing family of
children; the Petitioner, therefore, humbly prays your
Excellency to order that the condition of settlement duty may
be dispensed with, and a Deed be granted to her of the said
lot of land; or, if the settlement duty is indispensable, that she
may be allowed a further time for the performance thereof,
or that relief may be granted to her in ~~some other~~ such
other way as your Excellency may judge consistent with the
public interest; and the Petitioner, as in duty bound, will
