That your Petitioner is a Native of
Buckinghamshire, that he served His Majesty
in the 62nd Reg^t for some time, from whence
he was regularly discharged, being reclaimed
as an apprentice; that with much Expense,
he and his Brother Thomas Lake (who served
five years & was Sergeant in the 20th Reg^t of L^t Horse)
are come to settle themselves under His Majesty's
Government in this Country; your Petitioner
therefore humbly prays your Excellency will
be pleased to grant him such a part of the
vacant Lands of the Crown as to your Excellency
may seem meet, & your Petitioner as in Duty Bound
will ever say Sebine Lake
