Sir,

In obedience to the order of L^d. Governor
Genl, bearing date the 23 February 1810, respecting
Claims to land, I have the honor to state to you
for the Information of the Hon^{ble}. the Committee of
Council, That by the 8th Claim of the Brit^{ish}
Land Commission in ^{May} 1813 John Lake claimed
the west half of Lot N^o. 24 in the 4th Concession of
Ernestown, under James Gardiner as the
original Donor - The Report says "allowed"
"Special Minute W.D.P."

The Minute of Search made by this Office,
states that James Gardiner was entered on the
Quebec Plan, for the west half of Lot N^o. 25 in
the 4th Concession, that Daniel Simmons & John
Sharpe were entered for Lot N^o. 24 in the 4th Con-
cession.

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Concession, and that neither of the Lots had
been described; in which state they are at this
time, and the Report of the Commissioners has
not been carried into effect.
