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To His Excellency, Sir John Colborne,
K. C. B. Lieut. Governor of Upper Canada,
and Major General Commanding
His Majesty's Forces therein,

The Petition of John Lake
humbly sheweth,

That your Petitioner, is a native of England,
born in the County of Oxford. That he enlisted
in the Thirty Seventh Regiment of Foot in 1811,
in which Regiment, he served his late Majesty,
seven years, both on the Continent of Europe,
and in the late War in Canada. That he
has never drew any land, for his Services,
though he has lived in Canada since he
was discharged. That he has done the
settling duty on ^{the East half of} Lot No 8 in the 4th Con-
of the Township of Trafalgar (new survey)
District of Gore about ten or eleven years ago,
and has never received any pay for it, and
that the person who located said half Lot
went at that time to the United States,
and has not since returned.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays
that your Excellency would be pleased to
grant him said half Lot

And your Petitioner as in duty bound
will ever pray &c.
