TO HIS EXCELLENCY SIR JOHN COLBORNE, K. C. B. Lieutenant Governor of the
Province of Upper Canada, &c. &c. &c. in Council.

The Petition of *Nicholas Lake*

of the Township of *Montague* in the District of Johnstown, in the Province
of Upper Canada, **HUMBLY SHEWETH**, that:—that your Petitioner is the Son of
the late Thomas Lake of the Township of *Wolford*
in the District of Johnstown, and Province aforesaid, a U. E. LOYALIST—That he has
attained to the full age of Twenty-one years, and that he has never received any Land, or
order for Land, from the Crown:—Wherefore, your Petitioner humbly prays, that Your
Excellency in Council will be pleased to grant him TWO Hundred Acres of the Waste
Lands of the Crown, and permit *Isaac Bowman* of *Hallowell*
to locate the same, and take out the Deed when completed: And your Petitioner, as in
duty bound, will ever pray.

Nicholas Lake did his duty in defence of the Province during
the said War.
