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To His Excellency Sir Charles Buxton
Governor General of the Province of Canada

The petition of Nicholas Lake of Brandon in the
District of Victoria and Province of Canada
Gentleman, humbly sheweth that he is the only
son and heir at Law of Richard Lake late of said
Governorship of Brandon deceased, that said Richard
Lake died in the year of Our Lord One Thousand
Eight Hundred and Sixty-two, and made a will
which will is not registered, that in said will he
devised to his dependent all his Real Estate, but no
mention was made in said will to his right to five
hundred acres of Land as the son of Nicholas Lake a
B. E. Landlot. That your petitioner has
applied for right to said five hundred acres
of Land to Edmund Manning of Belleville Esquire
your petitioner therefore prays your Excellency
that his claims may be settled the commission for
and in the behalf of the said Edmund Manning
And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever
pray -
