The Humble Memorial of Amos Lake, of the
Township of Maniposa in the District of Colborne and Province
of Canada Junior, Most Respectfully Sheweth,

That your Memorialist is the son of a Mr.
Leahit who has been a resident settler of the Township of
Maniposa for eight years, with his family, of which there are
six boys alive and four grown & married.

That your Memorialist is desirous of
becoming the purchaser of the North 1/4 of Lot Number Nineteen
in the eighth concession of Maniposa aforesaid, which has
been vacant and unimproved for upwards of ten years
as the accompanying Affidavit will shew.

That for the last two years your
Memorialist has paid the assessed Tax on the said Land and
has begun to clear upon the same with the intention of putting
in a large fallow of wheat the present year if the government
will dispose of the lot and grant him a title to the same.

In furtherance of the same your Memorialist
humbly prays that your Excellency in Council, may be graciously
pleased to permit him to purchase the N 1/4 of Lot 19 in the
8th concession of Maniposa District and Province aforesaid
and your Memorialist as in duty bound will ever pray

The Petitioner may be allowed to purchase the North
half of the Township of Frontenac in the Township of the
Township of Mariposa and he submits the Affidavits
of John Wilson & John Jacobs to prove that neither he
nor his father had been made there.
The whole of the 1/4 in the Township of Mariposa
was located in the name of Patrick McNamee June
1826 under an Order in Council of 19th May 1824 as
an Immigrant lot, and an Affidavit was filed
dated 20th July 1826, in which 1828 stating the settlement
duty had been performed. In Report of Inspectors
of June 1840 however represented the lot as unimproved
unimproved and the remark is added, "note over the
"settlement duty done". The lot was included in
the Schedule of patented lands published in April
1839. A notice of claim was given, but no further
proceeding appears to have taken place with a view
to substantiating the claim. Under these circumstances
there would seem no objection to the land being resumed
and it is therefore recommended that the location be cancelled
and that the North half of the lot be sold to the Petitioner
at a valuation by the District Agent.
