Upper Canada Land Petitions "W" Bundle 22, 1839-1841

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The Petition of *Elizabeth Walker* of the Town Ship of
Ernest Town in the *Madawaska* District, Province of Upper Canada, humbly sheweth
that your Petitioner is the *Daughter* of *Daniel Walker* son of the Town Ship of
Ernest Town in the *Madawaska* District, a U. E. LOYALIST

That your Petitioner is *twenty one years of age* and has never received any Land or
order for Land from the Crown. Your Petitioner therefore prays that your *Grace* will be pleased to
grant unto her two hundred acres of the waste Lands of the Crown, and permit

to be Agent to locate the same, and to receive the Patent when completed.
As in duty bound will ever pray.
