I also inclose to You a Petition from sundry Inhabitants of the Township of Loughborough praying that some Person may be appointed a Magistrate & Justice of a New Commission for the Midland District in to take place I recommend Mr. Michael Stoot, who was formerly mentioned by Mr. Cartwright, may I also beg leave for Permission to locate some Lots in the Rear Concession of the Township of Beckmond which appear Vacant, only under the Lieutenant Gov. particular order not being open for Location without a Specific order

The Petition of the Inhabitants of the Township  
of Loughborough

Humbly Sheweth

That your petitioners labouring under difficulty  
from there being no Magistrate in the Vicinity or  
now nearer than the Town of Kingston the distance  
of at least eighteen Miles, that your Petitioners have  
frequently applied to the Magistrates in Kingston  
to lay out roads, although not absolutely refused yet  
have experienced much inconvenience from their not  
immediately attending, that your petitioners are liable  
to be called before the Courts of Requests in the Town  
of Kingston which incurs a heavy expense. That your  
Petitioners Number are sufficient to hold Town Meetings  
that your petitioners must attend at Kingston to obtain  
a Magistrates order for holding a Town Meeting, and  
that the Different Officers Chosen at the Town Meeting  
must attend at Kingston to be sworn into Office  
Your Petitioners therefore pray that some person  
in the Township of Loughborough or its Neighbourhood  
may be appointed Magistrate to ~~reside~~ <sup>reside</sup> the inconvenience  
represented
